"I will walk about in freedom, for I have sought out your truth and your wisdom." ~ Psalm 119:45

With Independence Day approaching (July 4th), I wanted to focus on some of the patriotic songs in our hymnals.

The following titles are listed under "NATIONAL SONGS" or "PATRIOTIC" in the ELW (red hymnal at both churches) and STTL (blue hymnal at United): "America, the Beautiful", "Before You, Lord, We Bow", "Eternal Father, Strong to Save", "Four Things" (A prayer for our country, the nations around us and all the countries of the world), "God Bless Our Native Land", "God of our Fathers", "God Save the Queen", "If My People Will Pray", "Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory" (Inspired by an abolitionist song, and composed as a response to slavery during the Civil War, it is sung today in celebration and anticipation of Christ's return and final victory.), "My Country, 'Tis of Thee", "O Canada", "The Right Hand of God", "The Star-spangled Banner" (This is not a hymn or sacred song — it is a recounting through music of a military battle.), "This is My Song" (A song of prayer for peace and hope that recognizes that other people in other nations have similar desires and needs), "We Praise Thee, O God, Our Redeemer".

We could also include: "Onward, Christian Soldiers" (Often misunderstood as a military hymn, in reality it is a processional hymn for use in an Anglican religious festival, with language making clear the struggle is against Satan.) and "Lift Every Voice and Sing" (A song of hope and faith with images derived from the experiences of African-Americans in the USA.).

It is interesting to note that "God Bless America" typically does not appear in hymnals in many denominations possibly because it is written in a predominantly secular, popular song style more appropriate to Kate Smith, Rotary Clubs, and civic occasions than to sacred worship.

As we pause to remember and celebrate our independence let us keep in mind the whole reason the original settlers came to America was for religious freedom. Without Christ, that reason would not have existed. Don't forget to honor the perfector and author of our ultimate freedom, Jesus Christ.
